The Mackenzie Gas Project is a proposal to construct and operate a natural gas pipeline and associated facilities to transport natural gas from a point near Inuvik, on the Mackenzie Delta in the Northwest Territories, to an interconnect point with the TransCanada PipeLines system in Alberta.
